

Teething:

First teeth visually appear in children between 4 months and 15 months. Signs of teething include fussiness, drooling, and a low grade fever. Teething does not cause high fever or diarrhea. Tylenol can help relieve the pain. Often, older infants enjoy biting on a teething toy or a frozen bagel.

Development:

Your child should be holding her head up when on her stomach and also may be delighting you by smiling, cooing, and laughing. Some children may begin rolling over and holding a rattle or a toy. Your child may like to suck her finger or thumb. This is a self-comforting behavior and should not be discouraged.

Immunizations:

Did your child have any problems after the first set of immunizations? Please let us know. DTaP, Polio and Hemophilis Influenza B (Hib)/Hepatitis B (Comvax) vaccines today.

Pevnar vaccine is also given today. Some babies may develop a fever within a few days of receiving this vaccination. If your baby has a fever higher than 102 degrees, call our office.
